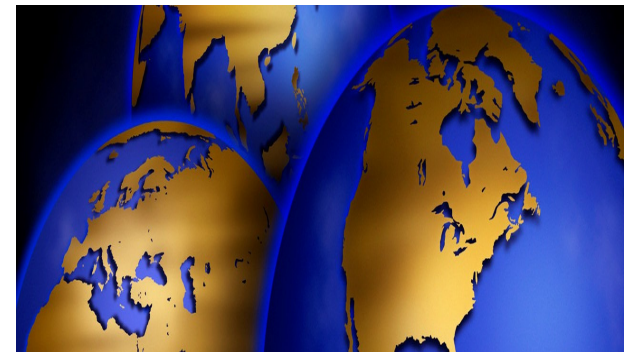

WORKCAMPNE

WorkCampNE exists to provide assistance in the way of minor home repairs to the elderly, disabled and under-resourced. Campers provide all the labor and WorkCampNE provides all the materials and tools at NO cost to the homeowner. Our volunteers will repair/replace: windows, doors, siding, wheel-chair ramps and shallow pitched roofs. We will scrape and paint and even sheet rock a room. We aim to make life more safe and comfortable for the resident. One of our main objectives is to allow people the chance to remain in their own homes long after they are capable of handling repairs themselves.

We will be a part of this mission experience as they head up into Maine to help residents repair their homes and share God's love with them in action.

MEXICO PROJECT

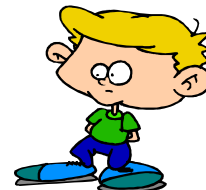
Through a partnership with the Salvation Army, an all-female team will be heading to Tijuana, Mexico to work alongside the Salvation Army La Gloria Extended Day Care, an anti-human trafficking project. Supported by The Salvation Army Canada and Bermuda, the centre officially opened in October 2008. Children receive three meals a day and help with school work. At present 29 children are registered. Mothers, grandmothers and caregivers know their children are safe here. Community women fear human trafficking and the danger women and children face in their neighbourhood. Vans and cars drive through communities kidnapping young children, moms are selling their children to get money to support drug addiction and school children walking unsupervised to and from school are taken as captives
